Updates from the Admin Team

FHS Community,

With Halloween Weekend ahead, things have been a bit lively around school today with some fantastic costumes and plenty of sugar-induced activity from the students and staff. I have to say, it is really nice to see so many people being relaxed, enjoying the spirit of the times and being able to just be “kids” again (adults included!). Part of improving the overall climate of the school is to encourage this kind of respite from the daily pressures that many are feeling; homework, tests, projects, etc...all contribute to this tense atmosphere and times like Halloween provide a sort-of “pressure release valve” for everyone.

The Admin/Counseling teams have been very busy the past two weeks as we visited seniors and juniors in their language arts classes (and there are LOTS of them) to discuss our reporting/discipline process. Via results from our Student Support Survey, students in these grades asked for more information in this area. Our LA teachers were gracious enough to provide us some during their classes in order to provide detailed information and answer questions in a smaller group setting. We received plenty of questions, hypothetical, ethical, etc. and addressed issues around mandatory reporting procedures and the legal aspects associated with our entire process. These presentations are a continuation of our efforts to respond to the needs of our students. Our goal is to provide them with more transparency and avenues of support and trusted resources in the event they may need to access this process in the future or report something from the past.

Finally, I hope you get a chance to read the Flash this week as we had several cool things happen with our students and staff. A world renowned movie director met virtually with some of our senior LA students to discuss his film and other aspects of writing and producing movies. Our own Rupali Hoffman (Community Liaison for FHS) received an Impact on Education grant to purchase 2,000 bus passes which will be used to assist our students who struggle to pay for transportation to/from school. This is a big deal for Fairview and will go a long way to reducing the stress these students feel trying to solve this problem. Way to go Rupali! I was also able to have a great discussion with the parents that attended this week’s Tea with the Principal, which is always a highlight for me and hopefully informative to those who came out.

To all Fairview Families with students enrolled in a culminating AP or IB exam course:

We are excited to have streamlined our AP and IB Exam Registration System. **Please follow these directions carefully** to ensure ordering and receipt of the proper exams.

AP and IB Exam Registration are now open. All students taking an AP or IB Exam **must complete** [these forms](#). [Students, please click on this link and complete the forms CAREFULLY.](#)

The above link takes families to the FHS RevTrak system--there are two items on the left-hand side of the screen, AP and IB. If a student is taking 1 or more of each kind of exam (AP and IB), then both forms and payments need to be completed. If you are only taking 1 kind of exam (AP or IB), only that form and payment needs to be completed.

Any students taking one or more AP exams MUST also complete the MyAP sign up through the College Board and join AP Classroom, using the Join Code given to you by your teacher:

Most students have already completed the above step. If you do not sign up via MyAP, we cannot order an exam for you. **This is a mandatory step for AP exams. Please ask your teacher if you have questions about AP or IB exam registration for your class.**

BVSD News

This fall, the Boulder Valley School District will be rolling out the Raptor Visitor and Volunteer Management System in all of our schools. The software will help to strengthen campus safety for students and staff, as well as make it much easier for family members to volunteer at their child's school.

Part of keeping students and faculty safe is knowing who is in our buildings at all times, and the Raptor system will allow us to do so. The Raptor system will better allow us to track visitors, contractors, and volunteers in our schools.

Additionally, it will streamline the background checks that are required to volunteer in our schools, saving our family members time and making it more accessible and equitable for them to participate and support their child's education and school.

How does the new system work?

Upon entering a district building, visitors and volunteers will be asked to present an ID, which may be scanned or manually entered into the system. The Raptor system will check our visitors for sex offender status.

Once entry is approved, Raptor will issue a badge that identifies the visitor/volunteer, the date, and the purpose of his/her visit.

A visitor's badge will not be necessary for those who visit our schools simply to drop off an item in the office or pick up paperwork.

What if I don't have an ID or am undocumented?

If a parent or guardian does not have a US government-issued ID, the school staff member can ask to see another form of identification, or take the visitor's name and Date of Birth and manually enter the person's information into the Raptor system.

What information is stored or shared?

The Raptor system only checks the visitor's name and date of birth for comparison with a national database of registered sex offenders. No other data from the ID is gathered or recorded. The system is not connected to any other database such as the Department of Motor Vehicles, and information is not shared with any outside agency.

This is a good opportunity to reaffirm BVSD's position on immigration:

Boulder Valley School District remains dedicated to educating each and every student and ensuring they and their family feel safe and welcomed, regardless of their race, gender identity, legal status or any other factor.

- *BVSD will never ask for a student or parent's citizenship or immigration status.*

- *If we learn of a student's immigration status we would never share this with immigration officials.*

Serving all students is not only one of our school district's core values, it is a constitutional right. Our children are guaranteed equal access to education. We in the Boulder Valley School District believe every student should have the opportunities needed to be successful in whatever path they choose in the future.

We will begin by launching the system in five pilot schools within the next week. Following a successful pilot implementation, all BVSD schools should have Raptor by the end of November.

Este otoño el Distrito Escolar del Valle de Boulder implementará un sistema de gestión de visitantes y voluntarios llamado Raptor en todas nuestras escuelas. Este sistema ayudará a reforzar la seguridad de los estudiantes y empleados en nuestras instalaciones y facilitará el proceso para familiares para hacer trabajo de voluntariado en las escuelas de sus alumnos.

Como parte de la seguridad de los estudiantes y empleados, es importante saber quiénes están en nuestros edificios en todo momento, algo que podremos hacer con el sistema de Raptor. El sistema también nos permitirá supervisar mejor a los visitantes, contratistas y voluntarios en nuestras escuelas.

Finalmente, Raptor acelerará las investigaciones de antecedentes penales que son necesarias para hacer trabajo de voluntario en nuestras escuelas, permitiendo que nuestras familias conserven más de su tiempo y tengan mayor acceso equitativo para participar y apoyar la educación y las escuelas de sus hijos.

¿Cómo funciona el nuevo sistema?

Al entrar a un edificio del distrito, se les pedirá a los visitantes y voluntarios que muestren su identificación, que puede ser escaneada o introducida manualmente al sistema. El sistema de Raptor verificará que los visitantes no estén clasificados como delincuentes sexuales.

Después de aprobar el ingreso, el sistema Raptor emitirá un gafete que identifica al visitante/voluntario, la fecha y el objetivo de su visita.

No es necesario que los visitantes obtengan un gafete si solo están visitando la escuela para dejar algo en la oficina o recoger documentos.

¿Y si no tengo identificación o papeles?

Los padres o tutores que no tengan una identificación emitida por el gobierno de los EE. UU. pueden presentar otra forma de identificación o simplemente dar su nombre y fecha de nacimiento para que un empleado introduzca su información manualmente al sistema Raptor.

¿Qué información se guarda o se divulga?

El sistema Raptor solo compara el nombre y la fecha de nacimiento del visitante con una base de datos nacional de delincuentes sexuales. No se recopila ni se guarda ningún otro detalle de identificación. El sistema no está conectado con ninguna otra base de datos, como el Departamento de Vehículos Motorizados, y la información no será divulgada a ninguna agencia externa.

Esta es una buena oportunidad para reafirmar la postura del BVSD con respecto a la inmigración:

El Distrito Escolar del Valle de Boulder sigue comprometido con educar a cada uno de nuestros estudiantes y garantizar que ellos y sus familias se sientan seguros y bienvenidos, independientemente de su raza, identidad de género, estado legal o cualquier otro factor.

- *El BVSD **nunca** preguntará por la ciudadanía o estado migratorio de nuestros estudiantes o sus padres.*
- *Si un empleado del BVSD fuera a enterarse del estado migratorio de un estudiante, **nunca** se comunicaría esa información a funcionarios de inmigración.*

No solo es un valor fundamental de nuestro distrito servir a todos los estudiantes, sino también es su derecho constitucional. Nuestros jóvenes deben tener acceso igual a la educación. En el Distrito Escolar del Valle Boulder creemos que cada estudiante individual debe disponer de las oportunidades necesarias para tener éxito en el camino que desee seguir en el futuro.
